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CAOAC Minutes June 22, 2003

EXECUTIVE MEETING June 22, 2003

The meeting was called to order by Paul McIntosh (President) on June 22, 2003 at 1020 hours in Waterdown, ON. The following executives were in attendance: Tony Bernard (2nd Vice President), Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer), Sarah Langthorne (Corresponding Sec), Dave Boehm (Past President/Newsletter/Webmaster) and Miecia Burden (Recording Secretary). Also present were Dean Crawford (KWAS) and Randy and Teri Seufert (TFCEC/FAAS-CAOAC liaison/Convention 2003). Udo Rohmann (1st Vice President) joined the meeting in progress.

Treasurer's Report: Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer) reported a balance of \$2937.94. Miecia Burden (Recording Sec) initiated a discussion about the committed funds. According to her rough calculations there will be about \$2100.00 in committed funds as of this September leaving us with a working balance of about \$300.00 minus any bills that are handed in today. She expressed concern that we will have to dip into the committed funds before new monies are generated by the membership fees, which are not due until January 2004. She proposes that we end the ongoing transfer of \$300.00 yearly into committed funds for program purchases (Motion 0009-03), transfer monies back into the general account leaving \$600 in committed funds for the purchase of programs when available plus other committed funds that are allotted for other reasons (apprentice binders). To be further discussed at the general meeting.

Corrections to the Annual Report: Annual report was not printed for distribution because Dave Boehm (Past President) questioned the mathematics when he was setting it up last week for printing. Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer), assisted by Randy

Seufert (TFCEC/CAOAC-FAAS Liaison) made the following corrections: Under the Income column - Programs \$90.00 should read \$45.00, Beanie Babies (aka Show Jars) \$700 should read \$622.00 and Cash on Hand is \$8.91. Under the expenses column - Beanie Babies \$562.00 should read \$537.51 and Balance should read \$2937.94 not \$2428.50.

The corrections to the Annual Report resulting in a balance of \$2937.94 does change the figures somewhat in Miecia's calculations. Instead of a working balance of \$300 there would be a working balance of about \$800.00. So the situation is not as bad as it seemed. Bills due today are printing costs for the update, postage for the update and barbecue supplies. These will be nearly \$400.00 and there are still some newsletter costs outstanding (bills due from Rein Breitmaier (Newsletter)). We still have some free monies available but is it enough to run the organisation until January of next year without dipping into committed funds?

OLD BUSINESS

Speakers on the web site: Several of the Convention speakers will be added to our web site.

Convention 2003: Randy Seufert (TFCEC/CAOAC-FAAS Liaison) gave a comprehensive report about the success of the convention. Although there were several glitches everyone enjoyed themselves thoroughly. Small revenue loss of about \$400 is possible. Some stats as follows: 74 conventioners registered, 198 entries in the show, 843 items sold at the auction, Tank Raffle (donated by Kingfish Services) won by Ray r. Show results have been sent to Terry Little (FRP/Open Show) chair. Randy thanked all the volunteers who assisted in some way that weekend and also complimented the executive of CAOAC for their attendance at the Annual meet-

ing held on Saturday afternoon.

Membership in CAOAC: Ongoing concern about non-profit clubs versus businesses holding membership in our organisation resulted in a discussion about types of memberships in CAOAC. A suggestion that consideration is given to a new category of membership for businesses was proposed as a solution to the problem. This could be a benefit to both CAOAC and businesses if they were part of CAOAC. Pros and cons discussed and further input will be requested from the reps this afternoon

NEW BUSINESS:

Elections: Paul McIntosh (President) thanked everyone for their vote of confidence and congratulated the other successful nominees - Tony Bernard (2nd Vice President) and Sarah Langthorne (Corresponding Sec).

Appointments of Committee chairs: To take place at the general meeting this afternoon.

Changes of meeting times: Executive at 1000 and general at 1130. Pros and cons discussed. In an effort to pare down the meetings an agenda will be adhered to. Only committees that have something to report will be called upon by Paul and if something is to be discussed it will have to be put on the agenda. Chairs will be required to e-mail or call Paul prior to the meeting to have something included on the agenda. Reps will be asked at the meeting for input.

Election Changes: A proposal to revert back to the old system of one-year terms for the entire executive was discussed. Two year terms with half of the executive elected one year and the other half on the alternative year was motioned in 2001 (Motion 0103-02) but in reality it does not work effectively. Discuss and ask for a motion at the general meeting.

Motions by the executive: After discussion, a proposal was made that any of the executive with the exception of the president can make a motion and

vote on that motion at general and annual meetings. Will be brought forth at the general meeting for discussion because this will affect the way we do business.

Membership Report: The Membership Annual Report was missed at the annual meeting two weeks ago. Membership annual report accepted on a motion by Terry Little (Brant/FRP/OpenShow), seconded by Peter Orphanos (Brampton/Futures/Steering). Voted on and carried.

Treasurer's report: Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer) reported a balance of \$2937.94. No transactions since the last meeting two weeks ago. Accepted on a motion by Peter Orphanos (Brampton/Futures/Steering), seconded by Randy Seufert (TFCEC/CAOAC/FAAS Liaison). Voted on and carried.

Treasurer's Annual Report: Corrected as per the executive minutes. Accepted on a motion by Terry Little (Brant/FRP/OpenShow), seconded by Dorothy Reimer (London). Voted on and carried. Dave will post on the web site along with the program annual report in the secure newsletter area of the web site.

Discussion about committed funds: See executive minutes for outline of discussion.

Motion 0306-01: That committed funds be capped at \$600.00 (for program purchases) plus \$40 (for the two apprentice judges binders) and that committed funds presently above that amount be transferred back into the working balance of the treasury. Motion 0306-02: To table motion 0306-01 for two meetings (vote in October). Motioned by Dorothy Reimer (London), Seconded by Dean Crawford (KWAS). Voted on and carried.

Secretary's report: Minutes from the annual meeting accepted on a motion by Terry Little (Brant/FRP/OpenShow) seconded by Peter Orphanos (Brampton/Futures/Steering). Voted on and carried.

Correspondence: Thank-you letter will be sent to Ray Lucas for the donation of three bottles of wine and photo album at the convention auction on our behalf. Cheque is coming from convention to Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer).

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Awards: Miecia Burden suggested that at the next convention the revolving trophies be put on display in the fish room for the entire weekend. Accompanying each trophy will be an explanation of the trophy. They will be engraved after the awards are presented to the winners, thereby maintaining the surprise element of the show year. The present system only showcases the trophy for about an hour and does not enhance our history whereas if they were on display all weekend everyone could appreciate them more fully.

Binder: Release #47 containing updates for Club Listings, Awards and Breeder Directory is available today. Those not delivered today will be mailed out over the summer. Thanks to Wayne Rakestrow (Awards) and Tom & Pat Bridges (Breeders Dir) for their assistance with this update.

Breeder's Directory: Submissions received from Hamilton & District Aquarium Society.

Convention 2003: See exec minutes for details. Randy was given a round of applause for an excellent convention.

Fish Rescue Program: Ray Lucas requests a copy of both the flyer that is supposed to be inserted in each aquarium and the poster that is used to advertise the program. Randy Seufert (TFCEC/CAOAC/FAAS Liaison) volunteered to head up a group to promote and start something States side. Conflicting reports as to whether the flyer is being put into aquariums that are sold in pet stores.

Futures: Questionnaire re: clubs/successes/failures. Peter Orphanos (Brampton/Futures/Steering) read several emails received from clubs. Full report coming. Peter also reported that he had done some further investigation into the objects of CAOAC and whether member clubs in CAOAC meet these objects and he found that there is no conflict of objects between member clubs and CAOAC.
