- About 30 years ago, not being satisfied with the quality of foods available, started making up the Master Blend foods which are used by many of the top breeders today.
- The fish have won hundreds of awards including International Male Grand Champion for the years 2000-2001 and 2002 and have been used as base stock by many breeders throughout the world in the past and present.

Treasurer's report: Read by Jennifer Bawden Miller (Treasurer) shows a bank balance of \$4263.58 as of December 31, 2003 with rent, insurance and calendars as outstanding bills totalling about \$3564.00. Still to be added in are the membership dues and insurance cheques from today. Committed funds are \$655.00

At the executive meeting earlier today the surcharge for late insurance was discussed. The insurance company has started charging us \$50 each time that we change the policy (adding or removing club names). This cost will be passed on to the clubs effective immediately. For example, any club joining CAOAC during 2004 will have to pay \$150 + \$50 = \$200.00 for insurance as well as the appropriate pro-rated CAOAC dues. Unfortunately clubs not renewing today are also subject to this increase in the surcharge.

For future years all membership and insurance monies will be due on January 1st of each year. The membership applications will be changed to reflect the new policy.

On Sunday, February 29, 2004, aquarium hobbyists from Ontario, Quebec and Upper New York State will converge on the Jack Purcell Community Centre for the Ottawa Valley Aquarium Society's annual giant auction.

The auction of fish, aquarium plants and related equipment is the club's major event of the year and anyone with an interest in aquariums is encouraged to attend. The doors open at 10:00 a.m. for the set-up, registration and preview of items to be sold with the auction getting underway about 1:00 p.m. The Jack Purcell Community Centre is located in Ottawa at 320 Elgin Street, just south of the intersection of Elgin and Gilmour Streets. There is no charge for admission and snacks and refreshments will be available.

Organizers of the event expect hundreds of lots of fish, plants and equipment ranging from the common to the rare and exotic. Many of the fish and plants going on the block are locally bred and raised with many species that are seldom found in stores.
