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Minutes of the Meetings

January 20th 2008

EXECUTIVE MEETING

Called to order at 1040 hours by Tony Bernard (President/FRP).

Executive absent: Randy Seufert (1st Vice President/CAOAC-FAAS/Futures).

REPORTS

Correspondence: Unsigned letter of complaint – as is our policy of dealing with unsigned letters we will not respond or deal with it.

Treasurer's Report: read and discussed by Dave. See general minutes for detailed report. Insurance company has been contacted and a list clubs requesting insurance has been sent. The premium has not been increased for 2008. As soon as the policy is received it will be emailed out to all clubs by Miecia Burden (Membership/Binder/Newsletter).

Awards: Paul McIntosh has indicated that he is willing to chair this committee for the time being. Thanks Paul. The executive will serve as the committee for this year. All the assets from the awards committee have been received from Wayne Rakestrow and given to Paul McIntosh. The assets consist of:

- One metal box of active award files
- One binder with Award section pages
- Miscellaneous paper for certificates
