to the club sponsoring the CAOAC Annual Convention. 25% shall be made available to each of the two clubs that in the opinion of the executive meets the following criteria:

Applications must be received by the CAOAC Executive prior to the November CAOAC meeting for sponsorship for the following year.

- 1. The speaker must be one that will promote interest in the aquarium hobby.
- 2. The club must undertake to publicize the event beyond their regular membership
- 3. Preference will be given to allocate the monies geographically i.e. West and East when CAOAC Annual Convention is hosted in Ontario
- 4. Preference will be given to co-operative events by more than one CAOAC member club
- 5. Clubs receiving funds must give a report after the event detailing attendance and what efforts where made to publicize the event.

Clubs are encouraged to tape or record the presentation with the consent of the presenter and to make a copy available for the CAOAC library.
