The regulations became law in December, however to facilitate trade they have decided that there won't be enforcement over the coming year but education for persons bringing in fish.

I understand that some people have already had problems importing fish and it would be very helpful if you would report any difficulties to me so that we can relay them back to CFIA. They are working on a form for hobbyists to import Schedule III fish (those that would nor-

mally require permits) however they are not contemplating a form for all of the other fish we import. I'm hoping that they will reconsider this course of action.

I'm happy to report that all of our members renewed in January, although a couple were just in the nick of time, and that we have two new members: The Greater Victoria Aquaria Society and Turtle S.H.E.L.L. Tortue.

All the best for February, hope you're still sticking to those resolutions.

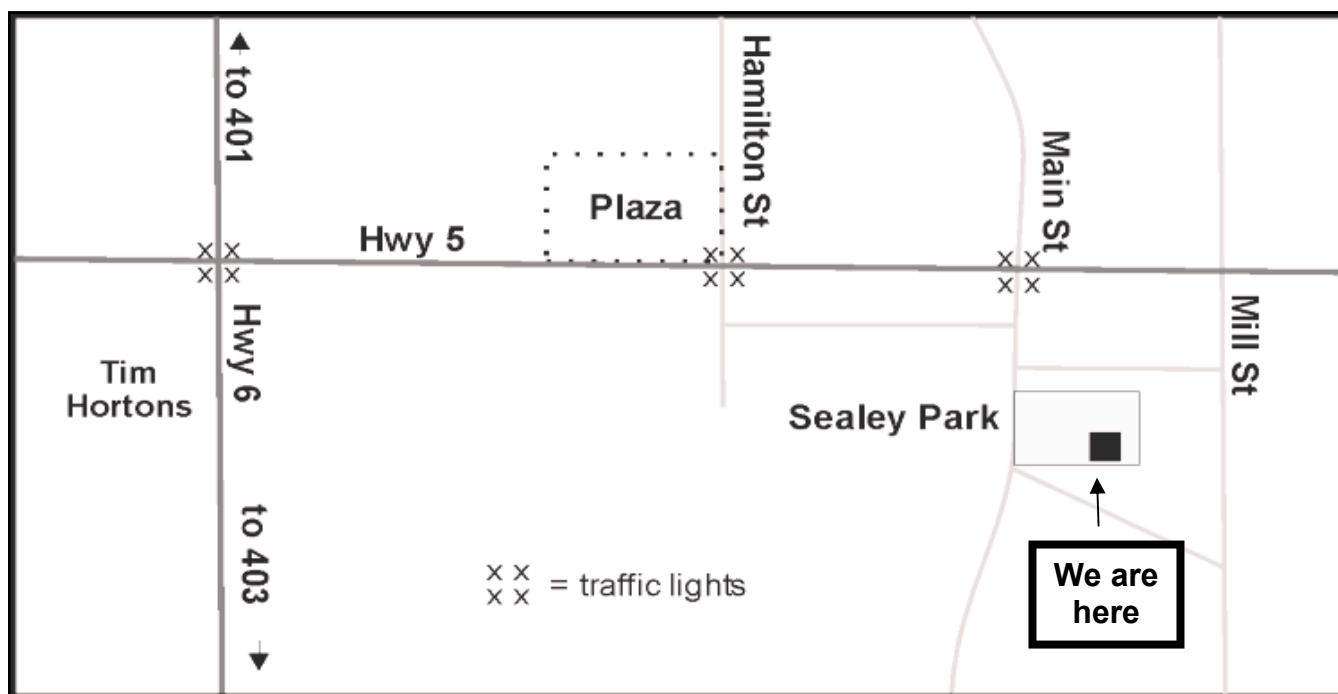
