On top of all this, Mike has opened a store with his oldest son, maintaining 270 tanks. As a teenager he had anywhere between 50-150 tanks, raising killies and catfish to make his pocket money - until his dad told him he had to get a real job.

FISH SHOW/COMPETITION RULES

(this show is sanctioned by the CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF AQUARIUM CLUBS)

1. Entry in the show is open to everyone.

- 2. ENTRY FEES FOR THE SHOW: ANYONE WITH 4
 OR MORE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE CHARGED AN
 ENTRY FEE. THE FEE FOR 1 TO 3 ENTRIES WILL
 BE \$1.00 EACH. There will be no limit to the
 number of entries by any one person. Judging will
 be done by certified C.A.O.A.C. judges or other
 people deemed qualified.
- Fish displaying any form of disease or deformity may not be entered and if entered will be disqualified.
- 5. Guppies and Bettas may be shown in drum bowls, show jars or one-gallon show tanks. All other fish must be shown in square gallon jars or aquariums but should be no larger than required to accommodate the fish. All aquariums must be supplied by the entrant. Entrants should provide a stand for any aquarium of 20 gallons or more. Please let our show chairperson know if you are bringing a large aquarium.
- 6. The containers in all but the above classes may contain the fish entry, water and air stones only. The only exceptions will be small box filters or heaters in tanks where entrants feel they are required to keep the fish healthy or the water clean. If desired, these may be removed immediately prior to judging. Keep in mind, that if left in the tank during judging the heaters and/or box filters might present some difficulty for the judges. Any entries using heaters must be arranged in advance with the show chairman to allow for hydro connection/s. No individual tank lighting except for class #39 'Aquarium Beautiful'.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the entrant to enter the fish in the correct class. Help will be available from the show chairperson. The judges or show chairperson have the right to reclassify any entries they feel are in the wrong class.
- 8. No entry will be allowed in more than one class.
- Air will be supplied. Entrants must supply their own three-way valves, airstones, airline page 8

and box filters and heaters (if required). Some supplies will be available at minimal cost.

10. THÊ FISH ROOM WILL BE CLOSED DURING THE SUNDAY AWARDS BANQUET. Any items left in the show room after 10 a.m. Monday will become the property of the St. Catharines Aquarium Society.

11. The St. Catharines Aquarium Society, C.A.O.A.C., Ramada Parkway Inn or any of their representatives will not be responsible for any loss or damage to fish or equipment belonging to entrants.

12. Entrants are advised to use covers on all tanks and to bring their own water supply wherever possible to avoid stress on their fish. Aged water will be available at 7.7 pH and hardness of 127.6 mg/L (medium hard).

 Awards will be presented to the first, second and third place winners in each class. Special awards will also be presented for 'Best of' categories, etc.

 One colour, plain backgrounds, supplied by the entrants, will be allowed on all containers.

 All fish will be shown in SINGLES only in all classes except 'Family', Matched Trio' and 'Super Pairs'.

- 16. 'Family' classes must include parents and at least 10 fry under the age of 3 months. Tank dividers may be used.
- Male 'Guppy' classes may include a female guppy in the container but it will not be judged as part of the entry.
- 18. 'Matched trio' class should contain three fish, identical in every respect. 'Super Pairs' must be a male and female of the variety/species; in cases where sex cannot be distinguished, two fish of the same species will be considered a pair.
- Minimum one live fish to be included in 'Aquarium Beautiful'.
- Any artistic medium will be accepted for the 'Arts & Crafts' class.
- 21. C.A.O.A.C. size guide, Axelrod's Atlas and Baensch Atlas will be used as reference books along with any other reference material that may be available to the judges and the show committee.



Kurt Zadnik

Lurt has recently relocated from California to Columbus, Ohio where he is now Managing Editor of the scientific journal 'Optometry and Vision Science'. He has been keeping tropical fish since he was 9 and cichlids

since his wife Karla made the mistake of buying him a 10 gallon set-up for his birthday in 1979. His California fishroom once contained 50+ tanks, filled mostly with dwarf cichlids from West Africa, South America and Lake Tanganyika.

He has been a member of the American Cichlid Association since 1982 and for three years served as Chair of the Special Publications Committee, producing two sets of the Cichlid Index for the ACA's journal, Buntbarsche Bulletin. Kurt is best known as an active member of the Pacific Coast Cichlid Association since 1982, and has served as Vice-President in 1987 and President in 1988-1989. He has been the editor of the PCCA's award-winning publication, 'Cichlidae Communique', since 1985 and has been distinguished by receiving the PCCA's highest award - life membership.

An award-winning author and photographer, his lecture covers the identification, maintenance and spawning of soft water dwarf cichlids.



Bob Goldstein is a native New Yorker who completed college in NY (Brooklyn College), a masters at Florida State University



He has written for all the major aquarium magazines since the late 60's and currently writes for Aquarium Fish Magazine, Pet Age, and Aquarist and Pondkeeper, as well as some game and fish sportsmen's magazines. His books include 'Diseases of Aquarium Fishes', 'Cichlids', 'Cichlids of the World', and 'Anabantoids' (all with TFH). He has also written ocean sportfishing books 'Coastal Fishing in the Carolinas', 'Offshore Fishing from Virginia to Texas'. His newest projects are 'American Aquarium Fishes' (Texas A&M University Press) and 'Reef Aquarium Handbook' (Barron's Educational Series), both of which should be out in 1997. He's a past president of AKA and was JAKA editor for 7 years.

His breeding experience includes killies, cichlids, marines, natives, catfishes, tetras, and some invertebrates. His 12 x 48 foot fish room has almost a hundred tanks to 135 gallons. Bob spoke at C.A.O.A.C. before when the convention was held in Pittsburgh. He lives in Raleigh, N.C. with his wife Joyce, a toxicologist with the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. They travel widely and in recent years have gotten into underwater photography while snorkelling.




