How the ghost knifefish became the fastest electrical discharger in the animal kingdom

The South American ghost knifefish (pictured) may not be the brightest spark in the animal kingdom, but it certainly is the most persistent. It has a specialized organ in its tail containing a small group of cells that can discharge electricity at frequencies approaching 2000 times per second, the fastest in the animal kingdom.



To find out how the ghost knifefish does this, researchers

compared the gene encoding the voltage-gated sodium channel, a protein essential for generating electrical signals, in the ghost knifefish with those of the glass knifefish, an electric relative, and the channel catfish, a nonelectric species. They found that the gene was duplicated in ghost knifefish approximately 14.5 million years ago, then acquired several mutations over the subsequent 2 million years, which made the channel fire more frequently and led to it being synthesized by nerve cells in the spinal cord as well as in muscle cells, the team reports today in PLOS Biology. The fish uses these electrical sparks to navigate, detect objects, and communicate.

The scientists say the findings could provide new clues about the genetic basis of epilepsy and certain inherited muscle diseases, which are associated with mutations in sodium channel genes.

Open Show – To keep track of any club CAOAC sanctioned shows, oversee/ or run the CAOAC annual show, present awards to individuals and keep track of show results and received

Programs – to maintain the CAOAC programs (DVD's etc.) and distribute as requested.

Steering – send out notifications to all clubs in regards to upcoming elections and run them at the Annual General Meeting if needed. Reporting results of elections.

Ways & Means – bring fun to the monthly CAOAC meetings and raise funds for meetings

Webmaster - maintain website and update with calendar events, and any updates



Special Notes about the Auction

"Toonie-a-Bag" Auction!

Simply, every item you place in the Aquariama Auction gives \$2.00 to DRAS. Just \$2.00. If your item sells for \$70.00 (and we have had items sell for that amount and higher), you get \$68.00 and DRAS gets \$2.00. Of course, if your item sells for \$2.00, then that \$2.00 goes to DRAS.

Why do we choose this format? DRAS wants to support aquarium hobbyists as much as possible. We want the hobbyist to get as much value for their fish and plants as possible and we want to encourage more rare and exotic fish and plants into the auction. Most auctions will take 30% of the selling price. Using this example, if your item sold for \$70.00, at a 30% / 70% split, the club would receive \$21.00 and the seller only \$49.00. DRAS wants to put as much money as possible in your pocket, and to encourage you to bring out your best fish and plants for auction. Using our formula, you receive \$68.00 and DRAS \$2.00. We rely on volume, but we want that volume to be special!



What is CAOAC?

We are often asked this question. CAOAC stands for The Canadian Association of Aquarium Clubs. We are a non-profit corporation and are composed of member aquarium, reptile & amphibian, pond & water garden, and similar clubs or societies from across Canada and the Northeast United States. CAOAC was founded in 1959 (incorporated in 1963) to allow the clubs to work together for their common good and the good of the hobby. Legislative issues, promotion of events, a judging system, national awards, assistance for new clubs, & liability Insurance are just a few of the things on which clubs can work and benefit together. Recently, a Fish Rescue Program has begun. This has been developed with outside partners who also have an interest in our hobby and environmental issues.

What are the benefits of being a member?

- National awards program to honour those in member clubs who have achieved success in breeding, plant propagation, or other endeavours related to the hobby.
- National judging program to train and certify judges as well as set standards that all can use to judge their shows.
- > Third-party liability insurance program to protect club members in case of an unfortunate accident at one of their functions.
- National forum to express views and opinions.
- National voice to deal with legislation which may impact negatively on our hobby and to put forward constructive ideas to politicians and bureaucrats.
- ➤ A chance to become involved with people who share similar interests with yourselves.
