

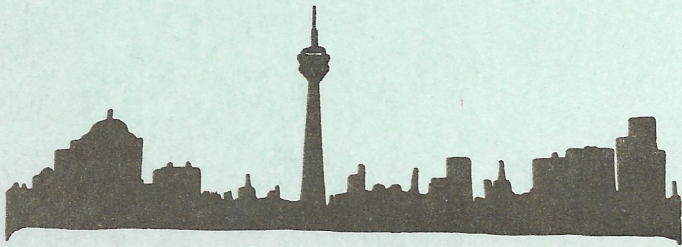

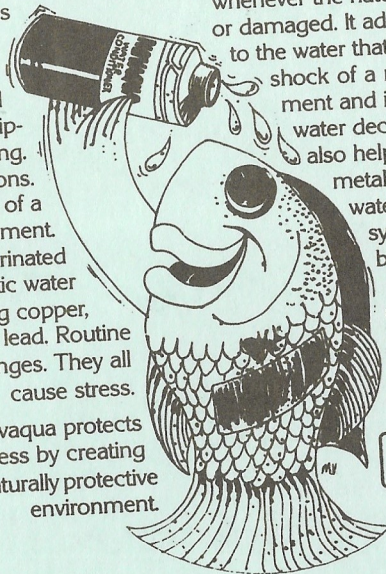

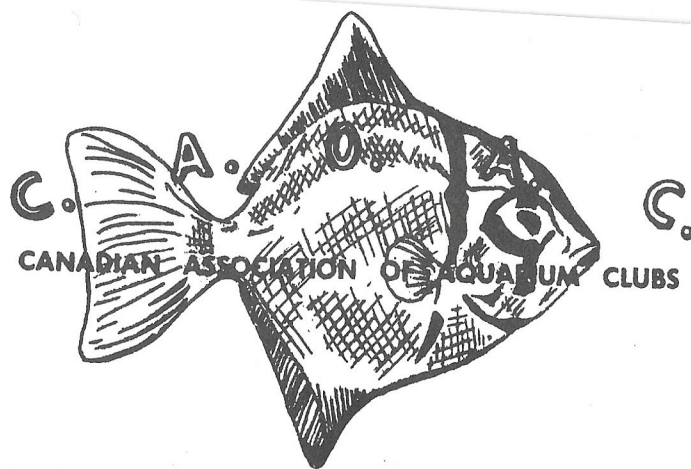

### MESSAGE

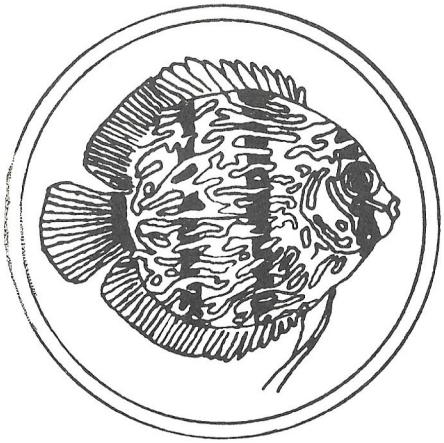

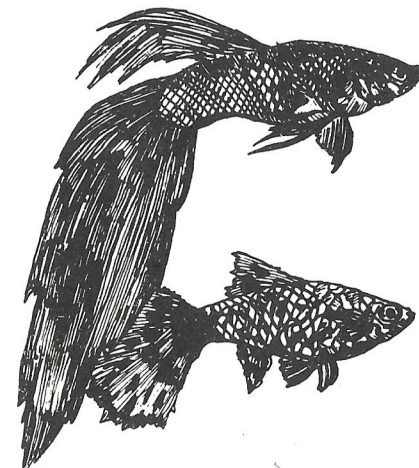

# FISH SHOW RULES

## 1. SANCTIONING

- This show is sanctioned by the Canadian Association of Aquarium Clubs.
- The Betta Classes of this show are sanctioned as a 'District Show' by the International Betta Congress.

## 2. REGISTRATION AND ENTRY FEES

- This show is open to all persons whether or not they belong to an aquarium society, or whether or not they attend other Convention events.
- \$1.25 per entry will be charged for all classes for any entry registered by Wednesday, May, 1980.
- \$1.50 per entry will be charged for all classes for any entry that is registered after Wednesday, May 14, 1980.
- Entries will be received at the Kent Room of the South Tower of the Loews Westbury Hotel between the hours of 5:00 p.m. - 10:00 p.m. Friday, May, 16, 1980  
9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Saturday, May 17, 1980  
8:00 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Sunday, May 18, 1980
- A service elevator from the parking lot to the show room as well as a stair entrance from Yonge Street to the show room will be available to entrants during receiving hours.
- All entries must be entered and shown under their proper classification. Class help will be provided in all classes if required. See entry form.
- Unless otherwise indicated all fees are to be in Canadian funds.

## 3. MAIL IN ENTRIES

- Mail in entries from the U.S.A. placed in the show must be sent via air mail, special delivery (all classes) to: John Cirelly,

Eastlake, Ohio, 44094. telephone: (216) 946-1765
- All mail in entries must be in the hands of John Cirelly no later than Thursday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, no earlier than May 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Mail in entries will be returned if sufficient postage is included with the entry form. If we are unable to obtain the minimum bid requested by the exhibitor wishing to auction his entries, the fish or item will be returned to him at his cost unless stated otherwise on the entry form.

## 4. SHOW CONTAINERS

- Guppies and Bettas must be shown in two quart drum bowls.
- Two quart drum bowls will be available at a rental charge of 25¢ per bowl plus a 75¢ deposit; maximum \$5.00. Mail in entries excepted.

## 5. SHOW EQUIPMENT

- Except for Classes 1-15 (Bettas and Guppies), air will be available if required. Exhibitors must supply their own three-way valve, air hose, and air stone.  
OPEN AIRLINES ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- In Classes 1-50, gravel, plants, ornaments, etc., will not be permitted. A solid coloured background will be provided. Exceptions may be made in cases where the health of the fish is at risk. Written permission must be received by the show Chairman prior to the show date.
- For the safety of the fish, aerosol and pump type sprays will not be allowed in the fishroom.

## 6. THE FISH AND SPECIAL CLASS RULES

- The class list indicates whether the fish must be exhibited as a single, a pair, or a group. A pair is considered to be a male and a female of the variety/species; in cases where sex cannot be distinguished, two fish of the same species will be considered a pair.
- Fish displaying any form of disease or deformity will be disqualified.
- For the purposes of this show, a "Cichlid of the New World" will be defined as a Cichlid indigenous to (i.e., native to) North America and/or South America.eg. all Cichlasoma, all Geophagus etc. A "cichlid of the Old World" will be any Cichlid indigenous to Africa or Asia.
- For the purposes of Class 46, Marine and Brackish Water Fish, a brackish water fish will be defined as a fish that:  
(I) is presently living in water of at least one half the salt content of normal sea water.  
(II) belongs to a species which can be found occurring naturally in water of at least one half the salt content of normal sea water.
- Entries in Class 51, Bowl Beautiful, and 52, Aquarium Beautiful can be furnished with rocks, driftwood, natural planting medium, and plants; but artificial plants or ornaments will not be allowed. Coloured lights will not be allowed. Entries will be judged on the condition and colour of the fish, beauty of the general planting arrangement and the overall appearance.
- Entries in the photography classes, Classes 55, 56, and 57 must pertain to the hobby and must not have been previously published. The slides of Class 57 will be shown at the awards banquet.

## 7. JUDGING

- Judging will take place between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Sunday, May 18, 1980.
- A judge has the right to disqualify any entry if he or she feels that it is in contradiction with the regulations governing the show. The judges' decision in all cases will be final.
- All Betta entries will be judged by International Betta Congress (IBC) Standards.
- All complaints regarding a judge, judging, or any matter pertaining to the show must be submitted in writing to the Show Chairman no later than May 25, 1980; with a copy of the complaint to the C.A.O.A.C. Judging Committee and the President of C.A.O.A.C. if a complaint involves a C.A.O.A.C. judge.
- The following books will be used as references:  
(I) Exotic Tropical Fishes (looseleaf edition) by Axelrod, Vorderwinkler, Emmens, Sculthorpe and Pronek.  
(II) Freshwater Fishes of the World by Sterbe

## 8. AUCTION

- A voluntary auction will be held with the Willowdale Aquarium Society retaining 40% of the auction price. Entry forms must show whether or not fish or items are to be auctioned. Such authorization may be withdrawn prior to judging. Under no circumstances may authorization be withdrawn after judging commences.
- Fish, equipment and supplies for auction other than those in the show must be registered no later than 11:00 a.m. Sunday, May 18, 1980. The number and type of fish, equipment and supplies brought for auction may be limited. Please note that there is an auction of dry goods as well as a mini-betta auction on Saturday. Items for this auction should be registered no later than 1:00 p.m. Saturday, May 17, 1980.

## 9. PUBLIC VIEWING

- All exhibitors and holders of convention tickets will be admitted to the show free of charge.
- The show will be open to the public between the hours of 1:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m. Sunday, May 18, 1980 at a charge of \$1.00 per person, children under 12 years of age free.

## 10. TEAR DOWN

- Tear down of entries will occur after and only after the end of the C.A.O.A.C. convention's awards banquet, unless written permission has been granted by the show chairman.

## 11. RESPONSIBILITY

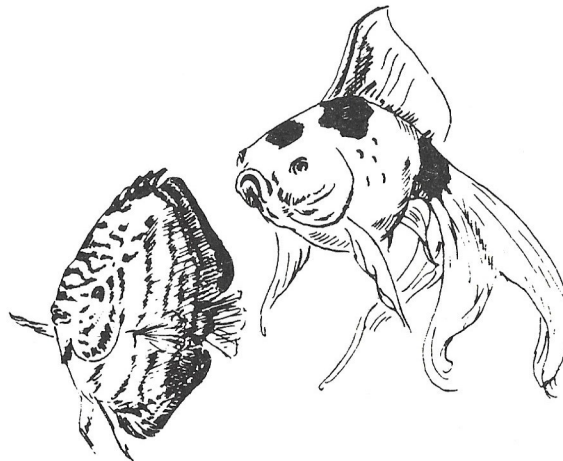
While the show committee will do its utmost to insure proper care and security of the entries the Westbury Hotel, the Canadian Association of Aquarium Clubs, the Willowdale Aquarium Society, the Toronto Betta Buffs and their members will not be responsible for loss or damage to fish, equipment, etc.

## 12. SHOW AWARDS

- A plaque will be awarded in each class listed first place. Second and third place awards will be rosettes.
- In addition to all plaques and rosettes a trophy will be awarded for:

- Grand Champion for best entry in the show other than Bettas
- The Best Egglayer in the show, excluding Grand Champion and other than Bettas
- The Best Livebearer in the show excluding Grand Champion
- The Best Male Betta in the show
- The Best Female Betta in the show
- The entrant who obtains the highest sum of C.A.O.A.C. points in the show (Individual Aggregate)
- The club whose entrants obtain the highest sum of C.A.O.A.C. points in the show (Club Aggregate)

- All points obtained in this show will be forwarded to C.A.O.A.C. and used in calculating yearly point totals for the C.A.O.A.C. awards. Entrants must specify on their entry forms which club is to receive the C.A.O.A.C. Club Trophy.



# SPEAKERS

*Jack Wattley*

Jack Wattley from Fort Lauderdale, Florida will speak on South American Cichlids primarily from the Amazon River such as Discus, Mono Sebae and Uarus. Having been to the Amazon River on three different occasions, Jack is well versed on the habitat of these fish. He has specialized in South American Cichlids for 18 years and currently runs a commercial operation from his home, including the artificial raising of Discus. As an experienced speaker and judge who has spoken throughout the United States as well as in Germany and Hong Kong, we feel that Jack will give us an exciting and entertaining talk. Kirk Taylor is an avid fish hobbyist from Mobile Alabama who is actively involved in tropical fish and plants. Until recently, he raised and wholesaled fish and plants from this location. Kirk is very familiar with raising and propagating most tropical aquatic plants in both aquaria and ponds. 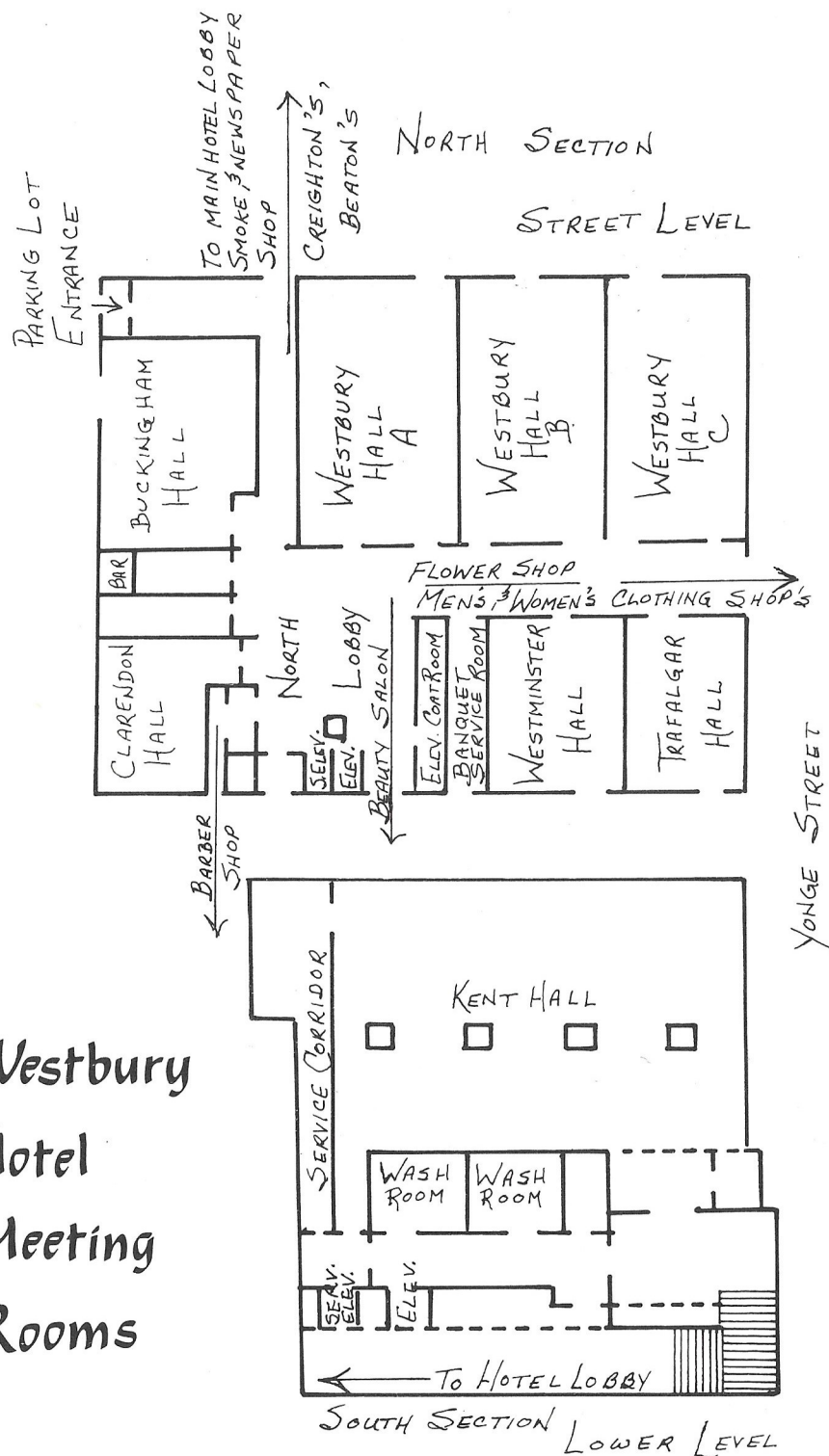
*Al Liebetrau*
