## HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS YEAR'S SHOW!

I am very pleased to have the privilege of being the show chairman for the London Aquaria Society for the second year in a row and especially this year because of the C.A.O.A.C. Convention. I know it is going to be a great show because with all the marvelous people working with me it cannot possibly fail. Another reason, of course, is because of all the enthusiastic members of C.A.O.A.C. and this great hobby, YOU PEOPLE, that will be bringing all your fish out to the show to be matched in competition and to make this the largest and best tropical fish show ever to have been seen in this city or at any C.A.O.A.C. Convention ever. This, as well as many other things, will help to promote the tropical fish hobby which is surely the basic reason for all our work and organizations.

We are very happy this year to have been able to design a unique trophy strictly for this convention which combines both our London Aquaria Society emblem and the C.A.O.A.C. Mono. These trophies will never be available again so you better get your fish prepared and bring them out to this show. We were very lucky this year because Hartz Mountain Pet Supplies Limited in St. Thomas has offered to assume the total cost of materials involved in the production of these trophies. Thank you Hartz Mountain.

This year we have taken several steps to make this a better and easier show for the exhibitors. We have an extra large fish show room that is 3900 square feet in area. There is a large freight elevator that goes right to the fish show room and it is big enough to hold a truck. In addition to this we are making large tanks available to exhibitors as well as our own small tanks for ease in getting your fish into the show. You don't have to worry about transporting tanks and all you do is bring your fish to the show and put them in tanks already set up and filled with water. The water in the show tanks will all be treated to remove the chlorine and make the water ready for immediate introduction of fish.

All the entries in the show will be fully labelled for identification of fish and exhibitors. We have a total of 15 more classes in this show than in the convention of last year including our special entries, THE PENTATHALON & THE DECATHALON CLASS.

We have made arrangements with Holiday Inn to set the fish room up and have it ready to accept your entries of fish at 6:00 P.M. on Friday so plan to arrive early and get your fish and yourselves settled in and then let loose for the entire weekend and have a ball.

The entry deadline is set at 9:00 A.M. Sunday in order to give the judges a little longer to judge the fish and give your fish a fairer chance rather than having them rush the judging to let the public and exhibitors into the show.

We have also applied for international status with invitations to I.F.G.A., I.B.C., A.C.A., A.L.A. and A.K.A. to participate.

I hope to see everyone of you at the new Holiday Inn in London for this 17th Annual C.A.O.A.C. Convention

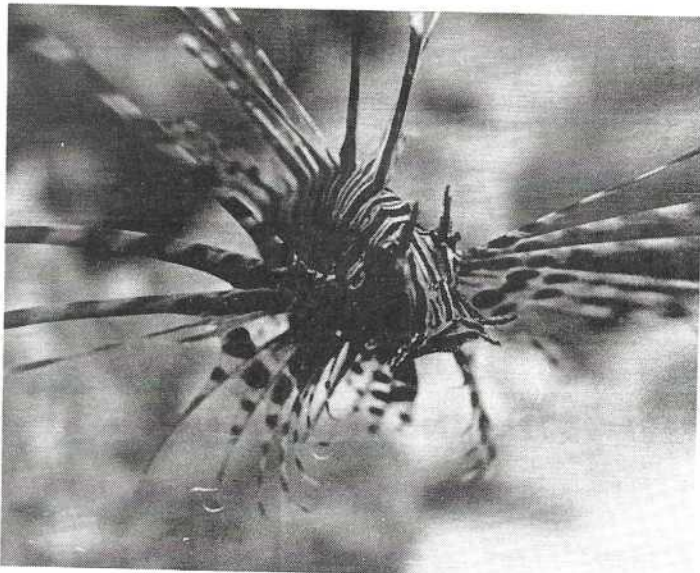

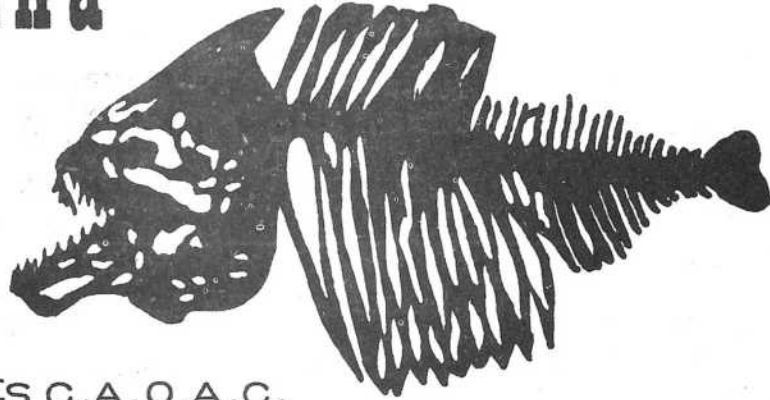

# SHOW RULES

## TROPHIES

For the convention show we have developed a special and unique trophy displaying our London Aquaria Society trophy head and the C.A.O.A.C. Mono emblem. It is a "one of a kind" prize and a collectors item.

## ENTRY FORMS

Please have all entry forms submitted by Monday, May 10, 1976.\* Exhibitors are requested to complete the entry form as accurately as possible in order to enable to committee to place proper identification tags on the exhibits for the public show. Please show actual specie name for all fish entries.

## ENTRY FEES

All entries are subject to a fee of \$1.00. Fees must be mailed with the entry form. Cheques and Money Orders should be made payable to London Aquaria Society.

## TANKS

All entries will be shown in small tanks supplied by the London Aquaria Society unless the exhibitor indicates his/her desire to bring own tanks and has exact dimensions marked on entry form.

All Betta and Guppy entries must be shown in drum bowls or square gallon jars to be supplied by the exhibitor.

The London Aquaria Society in co-operation with All Glass Tank Manufacturing Ltd. in Toronto will supply larger tanks from 10 gallon to 32 gallon to use for the duration of the show to fill any reasonable request providing this request along with the accompanied entry form is received by April 10, 1976.

## TANK BEAUTIFUL

Tank can be any size and nothing is allowed which is artificial. No artificially colored gravel or lights (eg. Gro-lux bulbs).

## BOWL BEAUTIFUL

Entry will be a one gallon drum bowl and will also be all natural the same as Tank Beautiful.

## NOVELTY CLASS

Open to your imagination. Anything goes, artificial or not.

## TERRARIUM

Everything natural.

## SET-UP OF TANKS

The tanks and bowls in all classes other than #39, 40, 41, and 42 shall contain fish, water, and air stones only. The only exception to this rule will be that small box filters will be allowed in tanks where the exhibitor feels an airstone is not sufficient to keep the fish healthy and water clear for the duration of the show. Any difficulty in the judging of the fish due to the inclusion of the box filter will be strictly the exhibitors responsibility.

## WATER

All tanks will be set up with fresh water Friday afternoon and will be treated with CHLORINE REMOVER. The conditions are PH - 7.4 DH - 8.1

## AIR SUPPLY

Air will be supplied to all tank display shelves. Exhibitors must supply their own three-way valves, air stones, air lines and box filters. No open air lines will be allowed. For the protection of your fish, it is suggested that the exhibitors bring tops for the tanks.

## BACKGROUNDS

One color plain backgrounds will be allowed and must be supplied by the exhibitors.

## ADMISSION TO SHOW

Paid convention delegates shall be admitted to the show free of charge. Exhibitors shall be admitted to the show free of charge. All others will be charged \$1.00 admission except children under 12 years of age when accompanied by an adult.

## SEXING FISH

Unless otherwise indicated in the show class list, all fish are to be shown in pairs. A pair is considered to be a male and female of the same species and only in cases where sex cannot be distinguished will two fish of the same species be considered a pair.

## ENTRY LIMIT

There will be no limit to the number of entries in each class.

## DISEASE

Fish showing any signs of disease or deformity will be disqualified.

## RESPONSIBILITY

The London Aquaria Society or C.A.O.A.C. or their officers will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the fish or equipment of any exhibitor.

#### TEAR-DOWN OF SHOW

All entries will be under the control and supervision of the show chairman and his committee and will not be tampered with. The show room will be locked during the awards banquet on Sunday, May 16, 1976 and no entries may be removed until completion of this banquet. Anyone staying overnight on Sunday may leave their fish in the show room until 10:00 A.M. Monday, May 17, 1976.

#### ENTRIES IN WRONG CLASS

Fish entered by the exhibitor in the wrong class will be reclassified by the judges if necessary. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make sure his fish are entered in the proper class on the entry form. If in doubt, contact the show chairman.

#### JUDGING

Judging will commence at 9:00 A.M. Sharp on Sunday, May 16, 1976. The judges will be appointed by the Convention Committee from the ranks of knowledgeable and competent hobbyists. The judges decisions are final in all cases and not subject to review.

#### ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted on Friday, May 14, 1976 from 6:00 P.M. to 12:00 Midnight, Saturday, May 15, 1976 from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., and Sunday, May 16, 1976 from 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. SHARP.

#### GUPPIES

Female guppies are allowed in tanks with single male guppies but will not be judged as part of the entry.

#### BRACKISH WATER FISH

Brackish water fish, eg. Monos or Scats etc., must be entered in class #34, any other variety egglayer.

In addition to these awards, each of the show classes will be presented with one of our unique custom made trophies for the winning entry. First and second runners-up will receive a beautiful rosette which was also made special for this event.

For the photography class we will be giving beautiful plaques for the first in each class and rosettes for second and third. There will also be a trophy for the Best Photograph. Artistic merit will also be considered in the selection of this photograph.

In addition to all these beautiful trophies, we will again this year be presenting our certificates as always with each trophy or rosette. These certificates have been re-designed for this years convention and have always been a hit with our own annual shows in London.

## PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST



#### Rules

1. The photography contest will be made up of 3 classes.
2. Print name and address on the back of each entry.
3. Prints can be any size.
4. Prints must never have been sold for publication.
5. Anyone is eligible to enter.
6. Entries will be judged on quality, artistic merit, and expertise.
7. Decision of the judges is final.
8. Entries must be listed on the standard entry form.

#### Class P-1 Color Prints

These will be of a single or pair of fish of the same species taken in color similar to identification pictures found in aquarium books and magazines.

#### P-2 Black and White Prints

These will be of a single or pair of fish of the same species taken in black and white similar to identification pictures found in aquarium books and magazines.

#### P-3 Action, Scenic, or Character Prints

These will be singles, pairs, or groups of fish or aquatic animals taken in either color or black and white. These prints may be of spawning sequences, show tanks (including fish), close-ups of parts of fish, or shots depicting a certain character. Let your imagination be your guide.
