## Mr. Paul Speice

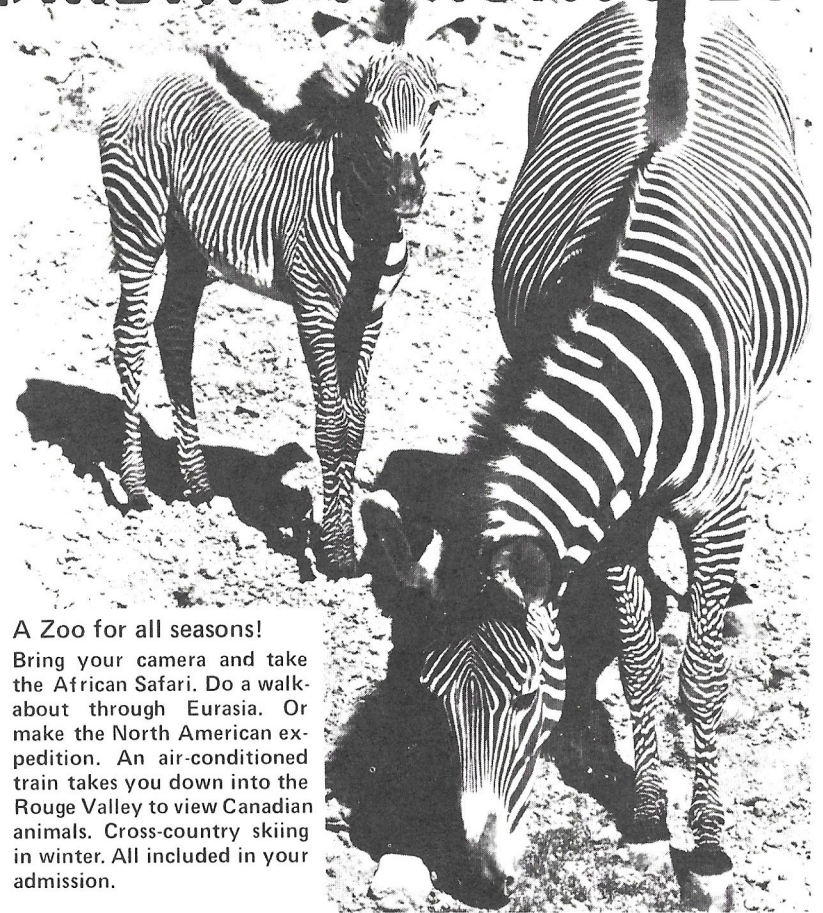

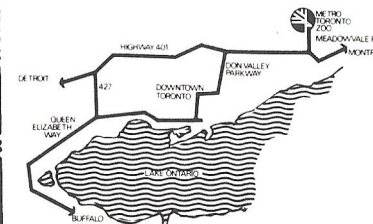

## GUEST SPEAKER



### Mr. Harold Benn

Harold Benn first displayed his lifelong interest in fish by collecting, keeping and eventually spawning some of the fish native to the north of England. This was during the thirties, prior to the second world war.

During 1946 his interest rapidly expanded into tropicals and the organized hobby. Between 1946 and 1957 he achieved success as a aquarium club president, became recognized as a show judge and during 1952 spawned the Angelfish.

During 1957 Harold and his family moved to Ontario and settled at Port Hope. He immediately became involved with the Canadian hobby; finally serving two terms as a vice-president and three terms as president of C.A.O.A.C. By this time, he joined forces in the hobby with his wife Mary, who was by now free from the ties of very young children. Together they first spawned Discus during 1963 and became involved by 1965, as a professional Tropical Fish Breeders.

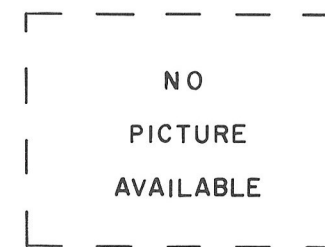
For the past seven years, Harold and Mary have owned and operated a Tropical Fish Hatchery and one or more retail outlets. The hatchery is of unique design which is the result of five years experimentation on the mysteries of aquarium filtration. This is currently his basic interest and subject of his continuing involvement.

### Mr. Harold Collis

Harold Collis has been a member of Hamilton and District Aquarium Society for fourteen years and is now a Lifetime member. He is a past President of the Hamilton and District Aquarium Society as well as past President of C.A.O.A.C. Harold has been a certified C.A.O.A.C. Judge since April 1971. He is a Past Chairman of the C.A.O.A.C. Show Rules Committee and at present is Chairman of the C.A.O.A.C. Judges Committee.



### Dr. Otmar Schoeneberger

Dr. Schoeneberger is a member of the Willowdale Aquarium Society. He is another old-timer in the hobby, having kept and bread fish for the past twenty years. He has bread the unusual fish including discus, killie, barbs and African Rift Lake.
